The International Meetings of the Students of the Academies and Faculties of Dramatic Arts SKOMRAHI¹ were launched in 1988 to meet the needs of drama art students across Yugoslavia, for communication and exchange of experiences and knowledge. Over the following years, the meetings grew into European and worldwide gatherings of students, aimed at promoting and celebrating the peculiarities of diverse cultures, through the work and educational programmes of many academies and faculties of dramatic arts.

This year, SKOMRAHI was conceptualized and curated by the current students at FDA.

The SKOMRAHI were middle age wandering actors that joined broken ends, bridged rivers, brought breaths from other countries, carried the message of acting skillfulness that entertains, mocks, laughs and angers, embitters and makes people think. In the name of the perpetual message that actors have always conveyed, even at times of wars, plagues, floods, the SKOMRAHI of today work, preserving it and enriching it with new thoughts and contents, with new love for the dramatic arts – living words of the wilderness and a perpetual message of the creative urge of people.

ABOUT FDA

The Faculty of Dramatic Arts (FDA) – Skopje, within the Ss. Cyril and Methodius University in Skopje, is an arts faculty and a scholarly and educational institution in the area of drama art, which carries out university studies in theatre, film and television through artistic and scholarly works, production and public presentation of works of art, as well as publishing of books and publications. The university studies in Drama Acting, Dramaturgy, Theatre Directing, Production, Film and TV Directing, Film and TV Recording and Film and TV Editing typically take eight semesters or four years to complete according to the ECTS guidelines.

The faculty also offers postgraduate studies in Playacting, Dramaturgy, Production, Theatre Directing, Theatre studies, Film and electronic recording, Film and TV Directing, Film and TV Screenwriting, and Editing as an Audiovisual Aesthetic Concept.

Exam performance of Drama Acting students, 3rd year of studies



Since 1896 when it was first staged, Alfred Jarry's *UBU ROI* has been constantly revisited by new generations as a mirror of the world they live in. Through the filter of their youthful courage and freedom from empty conventions and norms, this classic that foreshadows Dadaism, symbolism and the Theatre of the Absurd in European drama, is reborn on the stage again and again as political satire, absurd farce, grotesque comedy...

UBU ROI by FDU's Class of 2021 Drama Actors is probably all of this at once, and sometimes much more. Wholeheartedly rushing in and indulging at the collective play on the stage, in Jarry's parody of Shakespeare's *Macbeth*, which shamelessly mocks man's insatiable hunger for power, they not only find a means to bravely and fiercely laugh in the face of the horrible world they live in today, but they also find a field for collective artistic liberation.

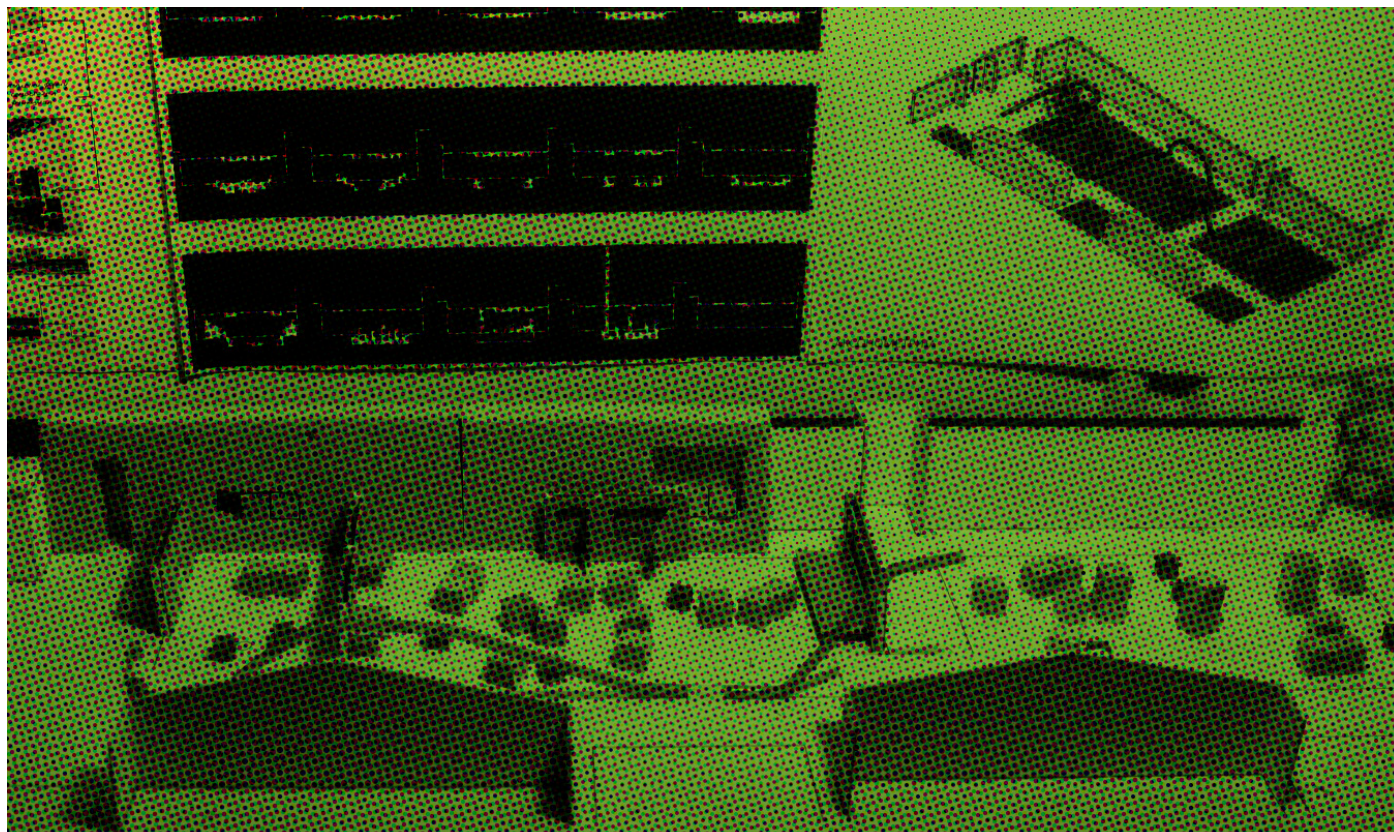

RE-USE OF THEATRE “WASTE” INTO USEFUL PUBLIC SPACE

Opening of the exhibition showcasing the working process for the production of a stage design intervention in public space



The idea of the project RE-USE OF THEATRE “WASTE” INTO USEFUL PUBLIC SPACE is to run a series of educational workshops and lectures, as well as practical work, for students to get to know the importance of sustainability and re-use of scenographic materials stored in a theatre’s fundus. The aim of the project is to show how such re-use can be useful for a wider community – students, professors, as well as other users/audience of the programmes of the Faculty of Dramatic Arts. As part of a structured educational work process, through a series of lectures, research and exchange of ideas between students, experts and professors aimed at creating something common, the students participated in devising/developing/designing and production of scenography in public space – the space in front of FDA’s Academy Stage.

At SKOMRAHI, we present this first phase of the project in an exhibition of several architectural conceptual synthesis solutions, and the project will be finalized with a spatial stage design (montage) intervention in the space in front of FDA’s Academy Stage.

In addition to the involvement of students and citizens in work that is the basis for building the content of the projects that the laboratory will deal with, this approach also provides the opportunity to activate cooperation with various institutions of the state and the local self-government, as well as project cooperation with similar collectives from the region and Europe that have already achieved considerable success in the processes of maintaining and upgrading the values related to the public discourse in cities. The programme of the Laboratory is part of the project The City As a Stage: Performing Public Space, organized by the Association for Culture and Art “Faculty of things that can’t be learned - FRU” / AKTO festival in partnership with the Faculty of Dramatic Arts - Skopje and the Faculty of Architecture - Skopje within the Ss. Cyril and Methodius University (UKIM) - Skopje. 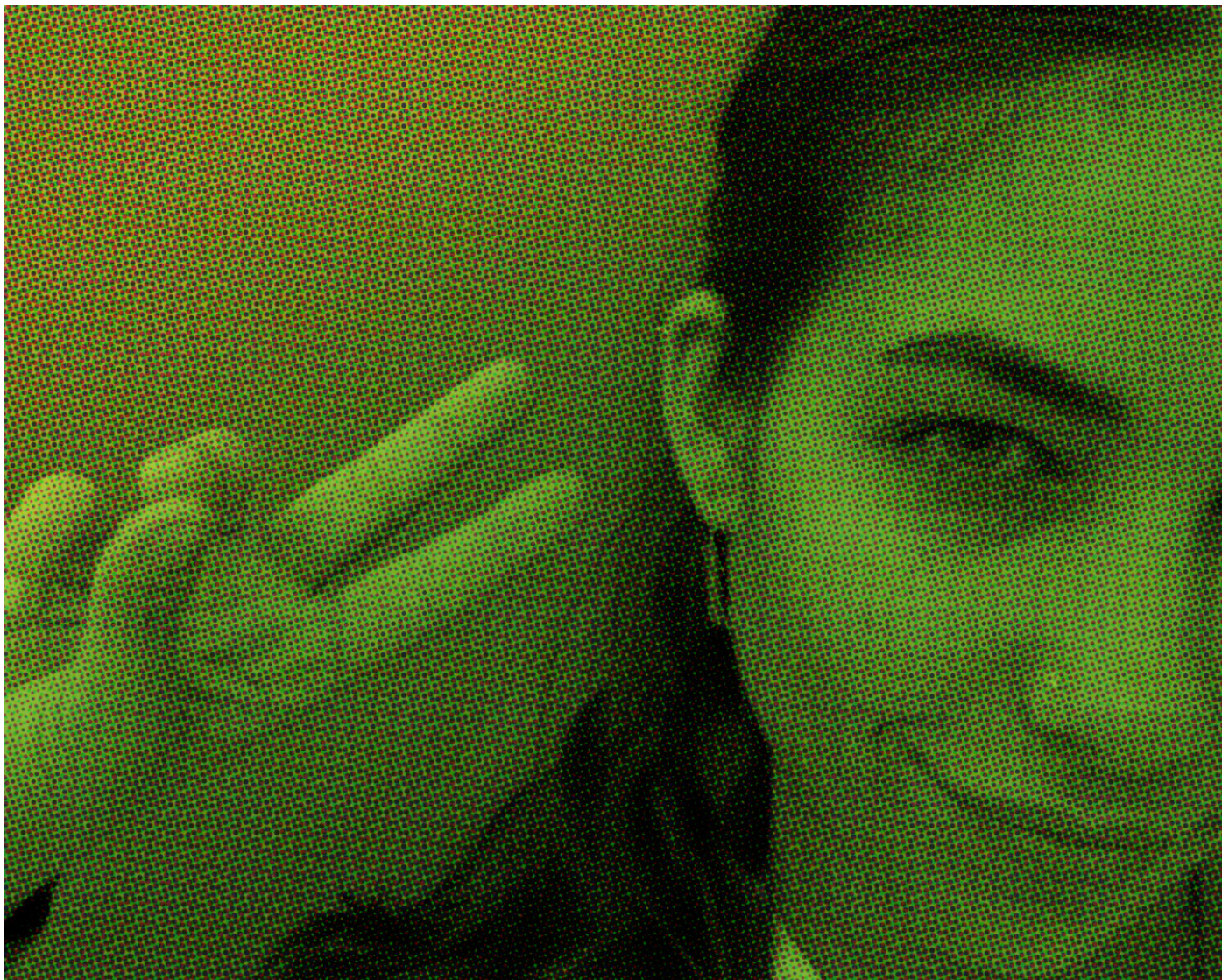

In the city of Skopje today, there are, unfortunately, only traces of the modernist utopia² created after the devastating earthquake in 1963, a rare ideal for a city built and tailored to the people and their right to use it. Many of the buildings/public spaces that are part of the world's modernist brutalist architecture, built in post-earthquake Skopje, are today abandoned, privatized, or otherwise disintegrated, and stand as “ancient” ruins in our urban and cultural landscape. Our society at the time had a rare opportunity to build a new city, a new idea for the future of the society and the idea of common life, to strengthen sharing and the relation to the common, to the public.

The Solidarity Tour, will shape a short walking experience through these “ancient” ruins of the city of Skopje, sharing different stories, historical and city narratives that transformed a city into a stage.³ The figure of the Flâneuse appears on stage to invite us not to be passive observers or wanderers in the modern city, but engaged doers in the late capitalist city, and to move from a self-conscious awareness of the urban experience to a caretaking and caregiving asset in the re-politicisation of the common.

“STICKER” OR HOW WE MADE A FILM TOGETHER:

Conversation between film director Georgi M. Unkovski, cinematographer Naum Doksevski, and film editor Martin Ivanov



In 2020, the short feature film “Sticker” by Georgi M. Unkovski was the first Macedonian film to premiere at the Sundance Film Festival. The film was subsequently screened at more than 80 festivals and won more than 30 awards. Sharing the experience from working together on “Sticker”, the creative team – the director Unkovski, the cinematographer Doksevski and the editor Ivanov, will talk about the importance of cooperation in creative processes and try to cast light on some of the specificities of the film profession that are revealed precisely through working together.

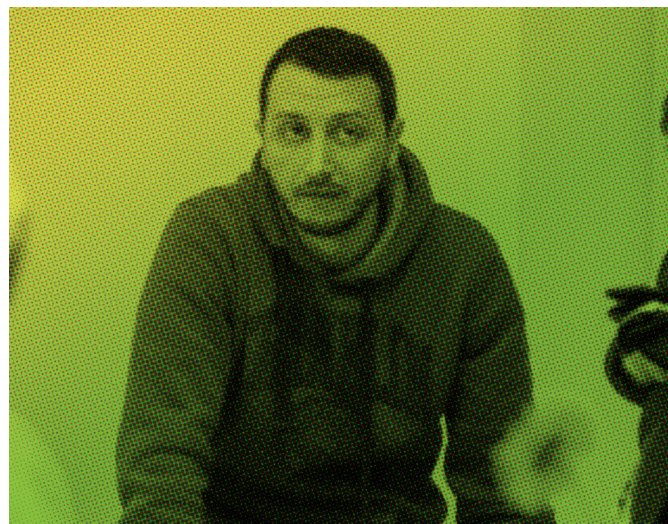
Georgi M. Unkovski is a film and ad director showcased at Sundance, HBO, MTV, Criterion Channel, and 150+ film festivals. He was born in New York City in 1988, spending most of his youth in Macedonia, Europe. At the age of 22 he graduated from the Rochester Institute of Technology - Eastman's School of Photography, in the field of Fine Arts (Rochester, NY). Shortly after his graduation he moved to the Czech Republic to pursue his passion in filmmaking and enrolled in the post graduate programme at the renowned university of FAMU in Prague. Since his post graduate studies Georgi has lived in Skopje, and works as a full-time director in one of the largest ad agencies in North Macedonia - “Futura 2/2”, as well as its sister agency “Cinema Futura”, dedicated to film production. He is known for his short films “Pepi & Muto” and “Sticker” and is currently working on the post-production of his first feature film “DJ Ahmed”.



Naum Doksevski is a Macedonian cinematographer with 10+ years of experience. The films he has worked on have been screened at numerous film festivals including Sundance Film Festival, Director's Fortnight - Cannes, Clermont-Ferrand International Short Film Festival, Shanghai International Film Festival, Montreal Film Festival, Camerimage Film Festival, and many others. His work has been awarded multiple times at international film festivals. One of them is the “Small Golden Camera 300” award for the film “Would You Look at Her” at the Manaki Brothers International Cinematographers Film Festival 2017. For his work on “Sticker”, directed by Georgi M. Unkovski, he received the Best Cinematography Award at the Overcome Film Festival 2020. Doksevski's debut feature film “Sisterhood”, directed by Dina Duma and produced by Marija Dimitrova, had its world premiere at Karlovy Vary 2021 and won the Special Jury Award. The film “Sisterhood” is now available on Netflix. His most recent achievement is the work on Goran Stolevski's Queer Lion-winning third feature “Housekeeping for Beginners”.

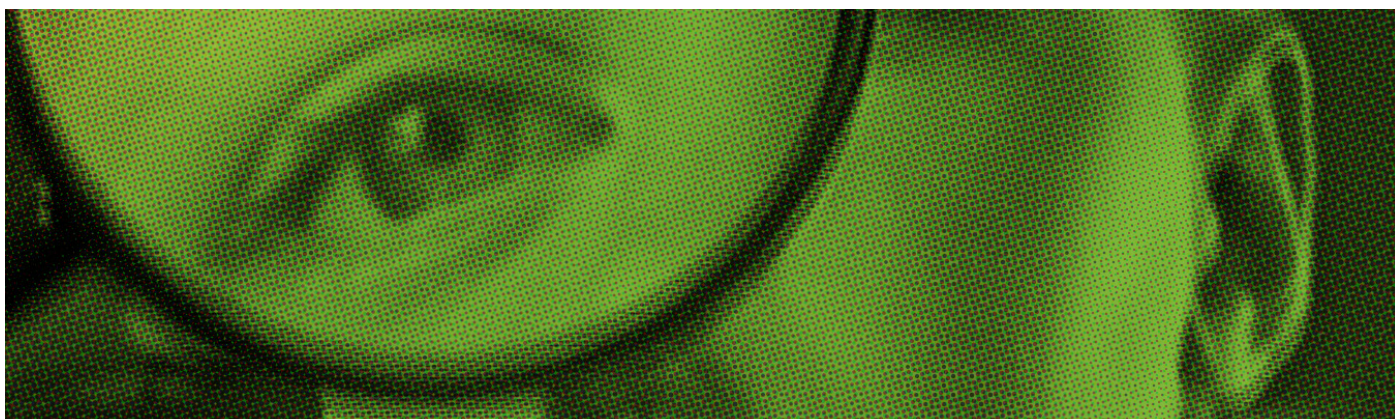
Martin Ivanov is a Macedonian film editor who has worked on various genres and styles of film throughout his career. Many of the films he has edited have received recognition at prestigious film festivals, including the Sundance Film Festival, DOC NYC, Karlovy Vary IFF, Clermont-Ferrand ISFF, Tallinn Black Nights FF, Shanghai IFF, São Paulo IFF, and others. Ivanov is co-writer and editor of the feature film “Sisterhood”, which received the prestigious Special Jury Prize in the East of The West competition at the Karlovy Vary IFF in 2021. Notably, this marks a significant milestone as it is the first Macedonian film to become available on Netflix. Before transitioning to full-time film editing, he simultaneously worked as both a film editor and an assistant editor. His latest job as an assistant editor was on the double Academy Award-nominated documentary, “Honeyland”.

Gjorgi Pulevski has graduated in Psychology, and holds a Master’s Degree in Policy Studies from the Institute of Social Sciences and Humanities, Skopje (ISSHS), as well as a Master’s Degree in project management from the University of Portsmouth, England. Since 2009, he has been participating in various projects and programmes in the area of independent culture and activism. From 2013 to 2018, he was part of the debate cinema “Kontra Kadar” in Bitola, where he co-organized over 120 socially engaged events with film screenings and discussions. From 2014 to 2023, he worked at the Manaki Brothers International Cinematographers Film Festival, first as a coordinator of volunteers, and then from 2020 to 2023 as a selector and coordinator of the student and children’s programme. As part of SCS Centar-Jadro he has organized and moderated discussions on topics related to philosophy, sociology, economics and subcultures. He is currently the programme director of the Philosophical Film Festival.

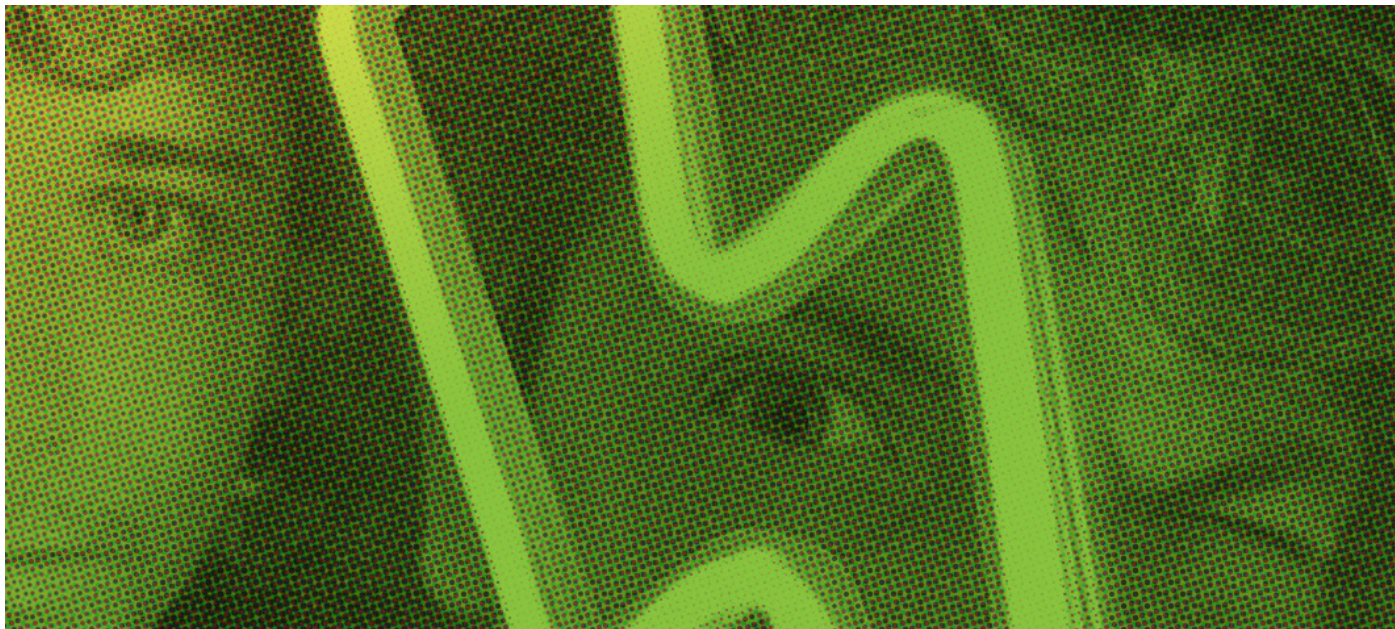
